

September 27, 2023 | Festivities included a Dedication Ceremony for Arlington's newest Texas Historical Marker—the Arlington Texas & Pacific Depot and Platform—and the intertwined Recommitment Signing Ceremony between Arlington and our Sister City, Bad Königshofen, Germany.

It was a great night to celebrate Arlington's train depot and platform and their role in Arlington's Sister City relationship. Arlington and Bad Königshofen's relationship has thrived for over 70 years, and the recommitment ceremony included an official proclamation and signing by both mayors. The signatures, signed with a pen, symbolized the pen-pal letters that started the relationship many decades ago.
